Annual shelf stable food drive. Our clients are homebound and unable to prepare meals for themselves. We don't have any age requirements, and we don't have income requirements. Recipients of Blue Ledge Meals on Wheels cover a wide range of ages and economic status. Many of our clients give a donation for their meals. You may wonder, why do we collect shelf stable food every November and December then? All of our delivery drivers are volunteers using their own vehicles. In cases of inclement weather, we will often have to cancel meals in an abundance of caution to keep everyone safe. In these cases, our meal recipients may not have any food in the house. We bring each client a bag of shelf stable items in December and again in January so they will have something on-hand should we be unable to deliver meals to them. Our wish-list of items for our annual food drive is all individual serving items that require little to no preparation in order to be eaten. Our food recipients can't use things like boxes of pasta, jars of spaghetti sauce, bags of stuffing, those items require the ability to prepare food. Our shelf stable food drive runs from November 21st through December 27th, 2024.

Become a Volunteer! We are always in need of volunteers. We all have busy schedules and finding drivers who can deliver on specific days requires having a large pool of volunteers to work with. We are an all-volunteer organization. We have no paid employees, everything we do is made possible through the dedication and generosity of our volunteers. We are specifically in need of substitute drivers right now. We will train you on a route and introduce you to our meal recipients. We will contact you when there is a need for a substitute on that route and if you are available on the day we need, you will pick up meals and deliver them.
